### John Aeschliman Passes Away

John Aeschliman, among the men who contributed to the building of Berwick township agriculturally, died at his home in Sabetha at 5:15 p. m. Monday, closing a life of industry, thrift and civic usefulness. Mr. Aeschliman was a native of Bern Switzerland, where he was born September 6, 1844. His age was 84 years, two months and 20 days. He had been seriously ill only a week.

Mr. Aeschliman had been a resident of northwest Sabetha more than twenty years, moving in from his farm west of Berwick school, the place now tilled by John Hartter and owned by John Hartter, senior.

Mr. Aeschliman came to America in May, 1850, when but a child. In 1876 he located in Nemaha county settling northwest of Sabetha, where he farmed until the spring of 1904. Since then he has lived at the residence where he died.

When John Aeschliman crossed the ocean from his native Switzerland it was in a sail boat. There were his parents, four brothers and a sister. The boat was tossed by the ocean forty-one days before the promised land of America was sighted. After locating in Ohio they later moved to Adams County, Ind., near Bluffton. Again they moved to a farm near St. Paul in 1866. That was a wild country then. An Indian raid on the settlers occurred and the Aeschliman family was but a short distance from where the red men committed their depredations. Soldiers drove the Indians away but the elder Aeschliman desired a more civilized country so another move was made to a farm in Woodford County, Ind., where they remained while John and the other children grew up.

From here John Aeschliman came to Nemaha county in 1876. He was married March 5, 1878, to Rosalina Strahm. It was a happy union, blessed by children who have grown up in the way they should go.

John Aeschliman leaves beside his widow the following children: Rachel, Leah and Joel of Sabetha; Effie of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.; Mrs. W. A. Cauffman of Ingelside, Neb.; Mrs. E. H. Sauder of Hillton, Kan., and Edward Aeschliman of Lincoln, Nebr. The deceased leaves thirteen grandchildren.

All the children were here to attend the funeral except Effie of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., who was unable to come.

Of his eight brothers and sisters Pete, Christ and Mary preceded him in death and he is survived by Joe Aeschliman and Mrs. Jacob Oppliger of Sabetha, and Philip, Simon and Matthias Aeschliman who live in the East.

Funeral services were held at the German Apostolic church in Sabetha Wednesday at 2 p. m. conducted by Rev. Edelman assisted by S. Imthurn and L. Locher. Pall bearers were nephews of the deceased, Robert, Harry, Sylvan and Dan Aeschliman, and Oney and Andy Rokey. Interment was in the Sabetha cemetery.
